Comments by the authors: Although cardiac rehabilitation (CR) has many health benefits, a large number of patients avoid CR or participate to a lesser extent. There are indications that this might be due to fear of movement (kinesiophobia). We therefore wanted to validate a measurement tool to investigate kinesiophobia and describe the prevalence of kinesiophobia at the start of CR. We feel this paper is very important because it shows that a valid tool for kinesiophobia is available and that many patients with various cardiac conditions suffer from kinesiophobia. In the future we aim to develop treatment strategies for patients with kinesiophobia. Read more

Analgesia by sacral surface electrical stimulation for primary dysmenorrhoea

Comments by the authors: Lower abdominal or pelvic pain of primary dysmenorrhoea often lasts for 8–72 h, and is usually associated with the onset of menstrual flow. We evaluated the effects of analgesia by sacral surface electrical stimulation on lower abdominal pain in women with primary dysmenorrhoea. Electrodes were placed on the skin over the lower spinal region, and stimulation was performed for 15 min at a frequency of 5 Hz. Visual analogue scale and degree of pain decreased significantly immediately after sacral surface electrical stimulation. Further research is required for comparison with drug therapy, and to assess its impact on drug dosage.
